INTRODUCTION



SPIRITUAL LIFE - IMPACT

Spirituality, today concerns what is holistic, involves a quest for meaning, is linked to 'thriving', and asks for a self-reflective existence as opposed to an unexamined life. Spirituality is given extreme importance and consideration in all our formation apart from the regular and normal spiritual programs.

DMI Chennai Province organised an Orientation for Newly Professed Sisters about Community Life from 10.02.2019 to 11.02.2019.





Sr.Deepa the novice mistress is very sad to inform that **Scholastica** who supposed to enter 2-year novitiate, sent home due to her serious sickness (heart problem) this was decided after consultation of doctor and Major Superiors.

One of our Novice **Theresia Aloyce** who supposed to enter 2 year novitiate was asked to repeat the first year novitiate since she has been studying for 6 months during her first year novitiate staying in Songea community

Dropouts from Postulancy and Student-hood

One of our +2 completed student left from Tumsar community as soon as she completed her exams. One of our + 1 student also left from Tumsar. From Saswad one student left after her + 1 and two of the postulants left because they could not cope up with their studies.

a. Field Exposure

The names of the communities as follows Annainagar, Nagapattinam, Kodikottai, Vadakaraiparai, Kavunchi and Salam.Community is the place where they could express their originality and get altered to become more human and excel in the religious life. They had good learning moving with people. They returned first week of November. They made their first commitment on $21^{\rm st}$ of December.

b. Annual Evaluation

The first week of November 2019 Sr.Antony DMI, Counselor for Formation, and Sr.Sasi Rani DMI, Assistant General, evaluated our Indian Novices in different aspect of their experience during field exposure and about the classes arranged. 

1. PROMOTION OF WOMEN'S MOVEMENT

The concept of women's movement is an integral part of DMI's development mission. For years, the organization has been one of the most influential platforms for promoting gender equality and empowering women. Great progress has been made in promoting a movement for women in terms

of integrating women members into the State Level Federation in Tamil Nadu. We are pleased to pronounce that 1,28,023 women have been registered members in state level as federation, and among them **56,395** women were active through 4226 SHGs distributed as 241 Panchayat Level Federation (PLF), 25 Block Level **Federation** District (BLF). 9 Level



Federation (DLF) and about **71,628** women are independently active as restructured PLF. For instance, the federation members are educated to practice values of democracy, shared leadership to address the socioeconomic issues of the marginalized women and children.

1.1. Promotion of Self Help Groups (SHGs)

In 2019, the year under review **241** new SHGs were formed through which **3363** new members joined the federation, adding to the cumulative total of 4226 SHGs involving **56, 395** women member





1.2Promotion of Women Federations



DMI catalysis the socio-political empowerment process of women by federating the self-help group members at different levels such as Panchayat level, Block level and District level as given in the table below:

1.3 Federation Training Programs

- Tamil Nadu state women federation is one of the model women federations in India with wellfully structured and registered individual membership data base for more than 55,353 members from 4226 SHGs. The State Level Federation (SLF) facilitates leadership at the district through capacity building trainings and facilitative meetings.



During the year, DMI organized training programs on Leadership Skills for key leaders in Pudukkottai, Perambalur , Kancheepuram, Chennai, Nagapatinam, Thiruvallur & Chittoor districts. Sr. Rengis Mary, State Coordinator, had facilitated the process of training on Women Development and importance of leadership.

2. SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

2.1. Development Trainings

We took several measures to improve the performance of SHGs, in the form of capacity building and strengthening the systems. A series of training programs were organized for DMI SHG representatives, federation leaders and SHG members to understand and explore the process of participatory governance and democracy. Regular awareness programs were facilitated for women to keep them informed about their rights so that they can access their rights and entitlements.





During the year, **11,052** women were enlightened, sensitized and trained on various areas of social development and Rights based knowledge such as Women and Child rights, Right to Information, Right to Food, Right to Education, Consumer rights etc... Members were also educated about environmental issues, and prevention of social evils.

3. ENGAGEMENT ON SOCIAL ISSUES

3.1 Non-functioning Street-lights

The residents of Puliyur village were suffering as there was no action despite repeated appeals for new street Mrs. Arul Mary, a resident of Puliyur village and a member of a DMI-SHG (Christhu Arasar SHG) from Nagai District refuse to give-up the fight. She submitted petition to District Collector along with the group members to install street lights. An immediate the inspection was carried out in the area by a team of officials. Now, the officials reinstalled 3 new street lights in the village.



3.2 **People's Initiative for Drinking Water**

DMI SHG women along with residents in Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts staged a demonstration against the shortage of drinking water supply. The frustrated residents including women and children blocked the road shouting slogans demanding their right for potable water supply. Revenue officials and police pacified the people and promised regular supply. The protest was withdrawn after the authorities restored the water supply on the same day.

3.3 Grass Root Democracy (Grama Sabha)

A vibrant Grama Sabha is essential for the effective functioning of Village Panchayats by promoting transparency and accountability in administration, enhancing public participation in the planning and implementation of schemes.

Our association with women SHGs made us aware about the need to mechanisms develop to facilitate community members get their rights, to actively participate in local SHG members governance. were motivated to participate in the Gram Sabha meetings to exercise their democratic roles in the local selfgovernance and to avail the Government schemes for their development. SHG women submitted for individual household petitions





sanitation facilities, free housing scheme, drinking water and other facilities.

As reported, on an average more than **1800** SHG members and federation leaders participated in the Gram Sabha meetings during the year.



3.4 Promoting Environmental Awareness & Responsibility

To curb the usage of plastic carry bags that are non-biodegradable in nature and negatively impact the the DMI-Tamil environment, Nadu federation has promoted women awareness in the community about the ill effects of the usage of plastic carry bags. Long-term exposure to air, water can cause synthetic materials like emit plastic carry bags to toxic To prevent this health pollutants. hazard, SHG members, field staffs from target areas participated to spread the awareness programs on ill-effects of non-biodegradable using plastic items. Planting trees is one of the easiest and most sustainable ways to positively affect the environment.

We understand that we should plant more trees because it is one of the most powerful ways to fight climate change and make a difference for the earth.





To promote the noble cause of healthy environment for all, DMI organized a tree sapling plantation campaign in its working areas. These campaigns aimed at promoting plastic-free & healthy environment. DMI Sisters and state team participated in the program and encouraged the SHG members to take-up such initiatives on a regular basis.

3.5 Promoting Food Sovereignty and Food Security

sovereignty Food empowering people (farmers and consumers) to make the important decisions about food and crop cultivations. The program aims contribute to to sustainable local food systems that safeguard people's health and environmental health and



promote sustainable agriculture. DMI team has organized an awareness drive on the importance of promoting healthy food, kitchen garden, organic food production, traditional foods and its benefits and also the rights of people to have safe and food. Altogether **1014** SHG members participated in various events connected to food security and food sovereignty. As an effect of such educative events **92** kitchen gardens were promoted. People learnt to produce their own vegetables for consumption.

3.6 Enhancing Nutrition Awareness for Healthier



The month of September 2019 was declared as 'National Nutrition Month' by the Govt. of India. DMI realizes that income gains are not automatically translated into health or nutritional gains at the individual level, especially in the cases of women and children. To address this challenge, DMI organized training-cum-awareness drive on healthy & nutritional food, diet diversity, organic farming, infant and young child feeding, reproductive health, access to safe drinking water and sanitation. Our interventions included awareness about importance of balanced diet to meet nutrition deficiency. We continued to popularize 'kitchen garden' as an easy solution to grow papaya, drumsticks, tomatoes, lemon and greens to enrich their daily diet, and combat malnourishment to reduce iron deficiency anemia and other disorders. This resulted in considerable increase in families opting for pulses, vegetable, and ragi (finger millets) consumption.

4. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM



Economic development program is an important component of the DMI women empowerment movement. At first, members of SHGs learn financial discipline through savings and internal lending. Thereafter the SHGs are in process to link with the financial institutions to obtain credits.

Training in finance management and orientation programs for SHG members are being done on a regular basis to get financial assistance from the banks.

Under the program, efforts have been made to enhance livelihood opportunities for the women associated with the SHGs skill development

training. The work had not stopped with training alone, DMI also strive to get the trained employed. For these reasons, staff team is already trained to provide them the right direction in identification and use of livelihood opportunities. DMI has helped **1851** women to become Self-employed and **1005** to become skill based employed till 2019.



Women are now self-dependent, increased their self-confidence and self-esteem to serve them better.





4.1 Vocational Skill Trainings

Through Vocational Skill Trainings, DMI aims to provide marketable skills to unemployed SHG women and youth so that they and their families can become self-reliant.

The trainings are given free of cost to the beneficiaries that can help them not only gain new skills but also sharpening their life skills such as team work, decision making and leadership. On 14 different trades, **728** women were trained.

DMI had promoted Skilled Tailors, Beauticians, CNC machine operators, Catering, Doormat, Computer operators, artificial jewelers, Food processors and Saree designers.

4.2 DMI - PMKVY Leather Skill Training Program

PMKVY Leather Skill Training - a joint initiative of DMI and National Skills Development Corporation (NSDC), Govt. of India, initiated leather stitching training for women (Goods and Garments Sector).

Training has been conducted for 3rd& 4th batch students at DMI Training Centre in Poonamallee, Tiruvallur district. DMI



focuses on enhancing the career / employment opportunities of individual, particularly women belong to economically poor families. 54women (two batches) were awarded course completion certificates issued by National Skill Development Corporation, Govt. of India.

4.3 Women Entrepreneurship Development Program

The DMI entrepreneurship association organized women entrepreneurs through self-help groups and helping in building up bonding among them to support each other in meeting their business challenges collectively. The year was marked with initiatives to create sustainable livelihood



for communities and efforts were made to facilitate knowledge sharing between various organizations in the districts that DMI works in. This Year, **400** prospective women entrepreneurs participated in the development programs and enhanced their knowledge on how to start and manage a business venture, investments, profits and social responsibility of an entrepreneur.

4.4 Exhibition cum Sale Program for Women Entrepreneurs

DMI provided opportunity to women entrepreneurs to exhibit and sell their products in order to increase their regular income. Women entrepreneurs from Tiruvallur district participated and benefitted from this program. This taken St. Joseph's had place at Matriculation Higher Secondary School Poonamallee.



4.5 Income Generation Programs

DMI'S LIVELIHOOD INTERVENTION TO BRING A CHANGE IN THE LIVES OF DISADVANTAGED SHG WOMEN

SHG women have a lot of potential and are the real catalyst towards change. But majority of SHGs lack investment, information, technology and skill. This is often fueled by the discrimination faced by her in the society. She is the caretaker of the children of the family, the elderly of the family but unfortunately has hardly any say in the economic decisions of the family.

Empowering them is essential, not only for the well-beings of individuals, families and communities, but also for the overall economic development of the country. DMI intervenes in this vulnerable sector taking care of the SHG women by improving their knowledge in different fields and helping them in earning a dignified livelihood on their own.

DMIs credit linkage programs have brought the financial services to the doorsteps of the poor. Women have received the maximum benefits from this. As owners of their own businesses, the women have started expressing their ideas and views on how to spend the loan amount. **390** women members were involved in various trades such as tailoring, beautician, agriculture, running small eateries, petti shops, vegetable shops, organic medical shops, tea shops, textiles, kitchen garden, artificial jewel making,

Xerox shops, livestock, fancy stores, provision stores, selling fish, flours, pickle, fruits, cloths, and flowers, running super market, producing leather products (shoe, wallet, belt making), selling cloths, shoe store, basket making, chemical shops and making,

selling snacks and soups etc., and their earning per month ranging from Rs. 6,000 to Rs. 12,000.

4.6 Micro-Credit Program of DMI

There is an acute need among the poor SHG women for credit that often decides the line between their survival and their surrendering to poverty. This micro-credit is required for basic necessities such as education for children, as well as for income generation activities. DMI considers SHG women are the most reliable in terms of repayment and utilization of loans.

Adding to this, entire household benefits when the loans are given to women. Further, it is argued DMI's microcredit can empower women since it instills strength and confidence when the poverty trap is broken. Twenty two (22) women beneficiaries from Nagapattinam and Tiruvallur received loan assistance from DMI Microcredit scheme to a total amount of **Rs. 7, 40,000** to start small scale businesses/ enterprises to enhance their family income so as to improve the standards of their living. In the past 7 years totally 1101 beneficiaries benefitted through this program.

5. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Self Help Groups are not only known for being effective vehicles for financial management but are also being considered as one of the best models to channelize the energy of communities towards community action, facilitating government programs and associate with other institutions. DMI has been able to produce several success stories of women who have been able to overcome all obstacles and make significant contribution to the society. In 2019, DMI team has reached out **2138 beneficiaries** and facilitated them to avail 38 different schemes of the government. The total amount of benefit received is **Rs. 57, 71,200**. The key schemes are maternity benefit, subsidized two-wheeler, old age pension, national family benefit scheme, widow pension, marriage fund, education fund, land patta, individual toilet, green house, aadhar card, voter's card, PAN card, smart card, ration card, community, income & nativity certificates and livestock development.

5.1. Access to Government Welfare Programs

The women's federations and SHGs were motivated to demand the Government authorities for welfare schemes which are designed to improve the marginalized people's living standards. DMI facilitated the inhabitants to avail the Government schemes without any hurdle. This year, **1546** beneficiaries were benefitted from 38 diverse Government schemes worth **Rs. 51 73.400**.

5.1. Government Schemes to Aid Economic Development - Livestock

DMI's engagement with the livestock sector is primarily around poultry, dairy and goat rearing. The focus of the dairy program is to help SHG women to adopt better rearing practices of this traditional activity. Dairy through cow rearing has been an important and widely practiced livelihood activity in rural areas.



We collaborated with Government livestock department focused our efforts on training the community in improved rearing practices. In 2019, DMI facilitated **592** beneficiaries to receive 5694 livestock animals (chicks, goats & cows) worth **Rs. 5, 97,800** through Government schemes.

6. Social Responsibility

An awareness drive with an aim to create consciousness on water conservation was organized by DMI-Federation. Women This event demonstrated the importance of rain water harvesting, concepts of water conservation techniques and attracted the attention of the public. We motivated SHG women and children to realize their responsibility towards saving water



and make sure they take proactive measures to ensure its effective management.

6.1 Humanitarian Gesture of SHG Women

Fire accident gutted six houses belong to DMI-SHG women in Kancheepuram and one in Perambalur districts. The families have been left devastated after all their belongings were destroyed in the mishap.

DMI Federation leaders consoled them and distributed



household items worth Rs. 28,000 to help them get back to normal life.



7. Community Health Program

Health is now higher on the agenda than ever before, and concern for the health of the marginalized women and children is becoming a central issue in development. Women in SHGs can work together to address issues that affect not only their own members, but also others in the larger community. When a SHG woman falls ill, the entire household income often



begins to deteriorate because of high health-care costs. Thus, DMI has been working towards the motto of "Health for All and Health as our Right". To achieve this, we have often attempted to address illness and disease by organizing various awareness programs and free medical camps. Until we achieve our motto, our community health campaigns will continue in terms of health education, health camps and Right based processions. In 2019, DMI served **4468** (**Till 2019: 22,505**) community members through community health programs such as General medical camps, Eye camp, ENT camp, education on Vector borne diseases &Cancer disease and screening camp, TB screening camp, Outreach health education, medical and clinical services and psycho-social support.

7.1 Improving the Health of the Poor and the Needy through Medical Camps

DMI collaborates with local community health workers. the government, the private health sector and other civil society organizations to improve the areas public health services. We have conducted 20 medical camps in all the districts together and reached out to more than community members and enhanced their good health. Doctors,



Nurses and Para-medical professionals diagnosed the problems of the beneficiaries and provided necessary medical counseling based on their illnesses and they have also done the services of referrals for further treatment to improve their well-being. Simple medicines are distributed free of cost to poor people.

8. COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) programs was initiated at Thiruvalangadu, Tiruvallur district in 2013 to enhance the quality of life for People with Disabilities (PwDs) and their families; meet their basic needs; and ensure their inclusion and participation. The Program (CBR) was financially supported and guided by Community Based Rehabilitation Forum (CBRF), Banglore in association with CARITAS India. After six years of community service, the project period has been completed by end of March 2019.

DMI continue the services with its own source of funding and the program has been implemented in existing 12 Panchayats and now 9 more new Panachayats have been added. During the year, DMI team has reached out to844 PWDs (243 new PwDs in 2019) and facilitated 553PWDs to avail government schemes to the worth of **Rs. 11, 57,500**. As part of our new venture, DMI has involved in the women's empowerment process by forming 51 SHGs with 657 members during the second half of 2019.

8.1 Consultation on Accessible Elections

Mrs. Mohana (Secretary-Block Federation) was invited to participate in a review meeting headed by the District Collector of Tiruvallur District. The meeting was held at the Collectorate to review the Booth arrangements for people with disabilities in the recently concluded elections.



8.2 Rally on child rights

DMI along with Government Higher Secondary School organized a rally to create awareness among the children and to the general public at Thiruvalangadu Tiruvallur district. Children raised pertaining to child slogans protection and child rights during the rally. The school management thanked DMI for the opportunity given to the children to raise their voice for their rights especially for child protection.



8.3 Health Camps for MI(Mentally III)

Every 2nd Friday of the month, DMI organized a medical camp for PwDs and their caretakers in Thiruvalangadu health Block. Α trained officer distributes medicine and provides guidance for specialized physical care. month all the 28 **PwDs** participated in the camp.



8.4 Common Reflection Meeting

On 30th of January 2019, in Chennai at DMI Hilltop Centre, "Common Reflection Meeting" held in which all the 8 Partners with their staff team attended. All partners have shared their experience working with disabled people and the support received from CBRF, Bangalore. The partners presented a report on the 6 year of activities carried out in their respective blocks and a video presentation to recollect the work done. A discussion was held on the strategies of sustainability for the DPOs, and in what way the NGOs can support and guide the DPOs.

It was a fruitful meeting, where the NGO shared their concerns to CBRF as a strategy a "partners collective" had been planned to sustain the programs.

8.5 Disability Pension Scheme

DMI facilitated Pension (PHP) for 34 PwDs and Maintenance Grant (MG) for 14 PwDs from the District Differently abled Rehabilitation Office (DDRO), as part of the financial assistance program for disable people.



8.6 Project Monitoring Visits by State Coordinator

BDPO Meeting

On 23rd March 2019, DMI conducted a meeting for Block Disable People Organization (BDPO) members. The members of BDPO representing their Panchayats, shared the activities carried out in their respective area and had a discussion on the strategy to take forward the federation.

The discussion was mainly focused to ensure the sustainability after DMI's withdrawal.

DMI had also organized special meetings for SHG women at Harichandrapuram, Arcotkuppam, Sakaranallur, and Manavur villages in Tiruvalangadu block, Tiruvallur District. The agenda of the meeting was including the importance of savings, DMI-Membership development and economic activities for economic upliftment of PwDs families.





8.7 Livelihood Promotion

Financial assistance was given to 7 People with Disabilities (PwDs) belonging to the Village Disable People organization to enhance their Livelihood. All the Seven PwDs were supported with Rs.5000/ each to strengthen their economic activity so as to increase their income.

8.8 Job Placement

Tamil Nadu Rural Livelihood Mission along with Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) organized placement linked skill training initiative for youth in Tiruvallur Collectorate. DMI guided 67 youth including 23 PwDs to participate in the event and all of them were selected and got their training orders from the authorities.



8.9 Success Stories

Mr. Sathish is a tailor by profession from Harichandrapuram village in Tiruvallur district, lost his legs when he tried to cross a train track a few years ago. But he never gave up hope. Through our DMI-CBR programme intervention, he received all the benefits from the Government schemes and also received Rs. 30,000 as a loan. With this loan he bought a sewing machine, remodeled it according to his own needs; started his own tailoring unit and stitching garments for his neighborhood. He recently got married, at present he is earning Rs. 300 to 400 per day from his regular work orders. He is confident capable to full fill the requirements of his family.



State Level Wheel Chair Cricket
Tournament

CBRF Bangalore organized a State Level Wheel Chair Cricket Tournament at DMI Engineering College of Campus, Palanjur in Chennai 7th and 8th September 2019. The Tournament was conducted to encourage the People with Disabilities showcase (PwDs) to their skills and demonstrate their talents.



Mr. Naveen from DMI-Thiruvalangadu block represented Tiruvallur district and bagged "Player of the Tournament" award and cash prize of Rs. 2,000. He has been selected to represent Tamil Nadu state team for upcoming national level tournament.

"Suyamvaram"

Vasantham Federation Differently abled Persons and DMI have jointly organized "Suyamvaram" for differently M.R. abled people at ThirumanaMandapam, in Tiruvallur district. 22 PwDs from our Thiruvalangadu block had assembled at the venue. Mr. Elumalai found his life partner in the program and their marriage was held in Chennai on 18th November 2019.



8.10 Staff Monthly Review meetings

Regular monthly review meetings for staff members were held at DFT in Chennai. The meetings were facilitated by Sr. Rengis, State Coordinator to engage employees to provide an update on their progress in the project; reviewing and discussing outcome measuresand further motivate them to achieve their performance goals.

9.CHILD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

9.1 Promotion of Children Parliaments

DMI's vision is to friendly child create а society ensuring fundamental rights to survival, protection, development and participation. DMI believes that each child has his/her own strengths and abilities and if a proper platform is provided they will express themselves and excel in



their own way. Children parliaments are such a platform which enables the children to exhibit their leadership and develop their cognitive skills. DMI, at present, is engaged working with over **1848** children parliaments with **29,403** children of which **120** children parliaments with **2080** members were formed during 2019.

9.2 Imparting Child rights and Life Skills among Children

DMI has been working to sensitize children on child rights and issues faced by them through its children parliaments. Exploring various opportunities and creative ways to orient and interact with children, to spread awareness on child rights.



Other activities like children's day, summer camp, value education, life skill education and talent competitions were organized towards creating an environment which ensures protection from evils, the dignity and rights for all children irrespective of class, caste, religion or gender. More than **3935** children participated and motivated in children camps to learn and make a contribution to the society as role model children.

9.3 Child Rights

DMI recognizes the fundamental human dignity of all the urgency and their well-being ensuring development. It makes clear that a basic quality of life should be the right of all children. Thus, DMI organized a series of awareness and training programs on child 10 districts. SHG rights in members and children parliament members were educated on the



importance of child rights and Child Safety. Altogether 2419 children participated and learnt the basics of their rights and how to be safe from exploitations particularly from child labour traps.

9.4 Child Safety





Child abuse is one of the most harmful forms of child maltreatment and can have a lifelong impact, affecting children's ability to feel safe and loved, the way they relate to others, and their self-esteem. DMI had organized an awareness drive on child safety in our working areas.

9.5 DMI - Child line Program-Nagapatinam

As a nodal organization, DMI is recognized by Child line India Foundation, Ministry of Women and Child Welfare, Government of India. Apart from creating awareness about Child line 1098, DMI is also into rescue, organizing outreach and awareness programs and open house for addressing issues related to children in Nagapattinam district.

This includes rescuing a victim of abuse providing psycho social support and offering support to file a case with the local police, taking up the matter with the concerned Child Welfare Committee (CWC). DMI is working to identify, rescue and rehabilitate children who are into begging and on the streets by collaborating with the Police, Department of

Women and Child Development, of Education Department and Department of Labor. DMI has also sensitized the local the community members on prevention of child labors, Child trafficking and abuse. child Emergency phone service for children in need of help or children in crisis situation is provided and 700 children used the service during 2019.

DMI Conducted summer camps for children who are the members of DMI Children Parliaments in its operational districts. The objectives of the Children's Camps were many: To sustain children's interest in learning during holiday time when school routines are absent; provide them with learning opportunities and a space to explore their inherent talents through cultural competitions and games, develop their leadership skills, and groom children to become responsible citizens. Winners of various cultural events and sports activities were awarded.





9.8 Tuition and Day-Care Centres in Quarry Areas

DMI is working to increase to quality education children of Migrant Quarry workers by enhancing their learning skills and promoting child friendly learning environment. The project aims the most reach out to deprived children by bringing education and care to their doorsteps.At Thirisulam and Kamarajapuram 3 tuition centers



have been facilitated by DMI and 67 children are studying in the tuition centers.

10. SOCIAL CAMPAIGNS

This year the Development Mission involved in the following campaigns:

- Campaign to Protect Environment and Plastic Pollution (against use of non-biodegradable plastic materials).
- Campaign on Food Sovereignty and Security.
- Campaign against violence against women and children.

11. ANNUAL SPECIAL EVENTS

To enrich the community bonding and awareness of our women and children, DMI and federation leaders create programs that bring communities together and celebrate special days with themes to improve social bonding and solidarity. Environmental Day, Human Rights Day, World Food Day, World AIDs



Day, Girl Child day, Women's day, Children's Day International Day of Persons with Disability, and National Days of social importance had been observed in 2019, by the SHG and Children parliament members in all the districts.

11.1 Celebration of International Women's Day

For DMI, Women's Day is an excellent occasion for a gathering of SHG women to strengthen their unity, an opportunity to rejuvenate their commitment and also a channel to exhibit their ofconcerns women development and empowerment. The theme of women's dav 2019 "Think Equal, Build Smart



and Innovate for Change". In all the working areas of DMI, Women's Day was celebrated with honor and pride. Thousands of Federation members gathered and discussed about the theme. DMI Women's day programme is not only a celebration or large gathering, this programme provided a platform to the SHG women to exhibit their skills, joy and happiness, honouring and encouraging each other, besides building their capacity to fight for their rights. As special invitees and guests, women police officers, social activists, advocates, educationists, Government officials participated along with Sisters and Officials of DMI Development Mission during March 2019 women's day as per the theme. It was emphasized that all women have to think, build smart and innovate new changes for the development of womanhood.

In March 2019 DMI has celebrated Women's Day in 10 places. More than 10,550 women actively participated in the event and the activities include women's rally, speeches, sharing and facilitation of achievers. The women performed various vibrant cultural programs including folk dances and mimes. All the songs were meaningful and reflecting women's concerns towards new changes and development. It was interesting to observe, irrespective of their age women expressed their joy and showcased their talents. In many places women federation leaders were facilitated for their extraordinary contribution towards community development work and leadership.


12. I MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT


DMI implements a social security scheme for the benefits of the members of federations. It is a noble program and a joint venture of DMI and its beneficiaries. The number of members who have newly enrolled under the scheme is **2,248** and the number of renewals is **9,588**.

NEW INITIATIVES

15.1 "DMI Connects"

As per the directions of Father Founder and to rejuvenate our state level federation "DMI-**CONNECTS**" task had been initiated. As we are heading towards a new era in our development mission, we need to update our human resource and membership data so as to develop a meaningful mechanism (Digitalization) to relate and connect with each other towards development. The Mobile contact numbers of the SHG members were collected by our staff and key





leaders as suggested by the Founder to provide them support and guidance as the need arise in their families. We have collected 45,341 mobile numbers from SHG members and we are in the process of verifying the authenticity of the contact numbers.

16. Extended Services Collaboration with National and International Agencies

16.1 IFAD

The Society of DMI in Nagapattinam in collaboration with International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) working in 3 Blocks Sembanarkoil, Poompugar, Sirkali, covering 14 Panchayats.



The programme includes support for sustainable resource management in also coastal areas: it provides employment generation and skills training, empowering women to improve income and assistance their programme management.

Training Support to young Professionals





MSW students from Stella Maris, Loyola College, St. Joseph's college, Madras Christian College, Madras School of Social Work and Mar Gregarious College have been accepted to practice their concurrent field work and gain practical field experience in our working locations for the year 2019. All the 12 student trainees were helped to enhance their knowledge and skills and complete their concurrent fieldwork successfully.

17. Administrative Information

17.1 Monitoring

An effective monitoring system has been practiced in social work department, which include weekly, monthly and quarterly review meetings and periodic visits by state team. The staffs have regular review meetings in all the districts and at the district head office.

The weekly and monthly review meetings happen in the respective Districts where the DCO conducts the meeting for the BCOs and CCOs. They share their weekly activities and plan for the next week.

At state level once in three months Quarterly Review Meetings are conducted to strengthen the staff team and motivate staff to produce effective results of the implemented activities.





17.2 Staff Development Program

Review meetings and Trainings were conducted at Amala Bhavan in Chennai.

The training programs were facilitated by Sr. Rengis Mary, State Coordinator and Mr. Susai Michael. Consultant. Subjects such as strengthening women leadership through **SHGs** and federation processes, development of association, entrepreneurs



micro-credit management and membership development in the federations, were handled. Reports of activities for 6 months were presented by District teams and were reviewed. Feedbacks were given to create a healthy learning environment.



17.3 TOT training on Children Parliament

Mr.Justin, Program Officer and Sr.Judit, District Coordinator attended TOT program on Children Parliament organized by TASOS, Trichy and it was facilitated by 'Nine is Mine' organization on 30th, 31st May & 1st June 2019. Around 27 participants from different NGO's working among children attended the training and attained skill in facilitating trainings and knowledge on children Parliaments.





17.4 Capacity Building Programme on Violence against Women

Santhanam and Mrs. Jaya (Staff) attended a one-day capacity building training program violence gender based against working places women at in Perambalur district. It was conducted by SHED India NGO. Staff from 42 NGOs participated and involved in group activities that focused on breaking gender barriers.



17.5 Staff Tour

Sr. Rengis, State coordinator, organised a pleasure trip (26th to 28thSeptember) for sisters, field staffs and district federation leaders from Chennai, Kancheepuram and Thiruvallur districts. The staff team visited Magapalipuram, Joe beach, Velankanni shrine, Poondi, Thanjai Periya Koil, Kalanai, Samaya puram, & Thirunalaaru Saneeswar kovil. The 46 members' tour team had an enchanting and refreshing experience.

18. Special Visits

18.1 Project Monitoring Visit

As part of the project monitoring process, Sr. Rengis (State Coordinator) visited all the 10 districts in Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh. She facilitated the meetings for SHGs and staff team; motivated them to be aware of various Government welfare projects and inspired them to strengthen the DMI Tamil Nadu Women Federation by active and effective participation.





18.2 Core Team Meeting

DMI Development Mission core team had consultation with Ms. Marita (Consultant MISEREOR), at DMI Hilltop Centre on 25th& 26th February 2019. The meeting, mainly focused on the ongoing MISEREOR project, evaluation process. The new project core



team consists of Sr. Rengis Mary DMI (State Coordinator), Mr. Susai Michael (Consultant-DMI), 2 Program Officers and 3 District Coordinators discussed on new project proposal to be submitted to MISEREOR.

18.3 Review Meeting

Sr. Rengis, State coordinator along with Sr. Malar Jothi, Provincial organized a one-day meeting for the sisters belong to Chennai zone on 19th August, 2019. The discussions were mainly focused on ongoing development mission programs. As a team, they also had meeting with our **Father Founder**, where he motivated to rethink and re-strategize the programs to facilitate the target people to obtain sustainable livelihoods and development.

18.4 Cardinal Meets Women from Self-help Groups

Cardinal and a Bishop from of Papua New Guinea (PNG) visited our women groups at Poonamallee block in Tiruvallur district on 7th February 2019 and had interaction with them. SHG Women shared about the group activities and how DMI helped them to grow in all aspects of their life.Sr. Gnana Selvam DMI (Managing Trustee – DFT), Sr. Rengis Mary DMI (State Coordinator), Sr. A. MalarJothi DMI, (Provincial



- Chennai) and district coordinator accompanied them during their visit.

19. Challenges

Although there is remarkable success in SHG Federations and Children Parliaments, the movement has its own constraints.

- Restructured Panchayat Level Federations (PLF) is directly being controlled by the Government officials who interrupt the implementation of our key activities particularly to form women SHGs and strengthening the federation and our relationship with PLF. Such issues reduce the space for NGOs.
- Lack of DMI owned microcredit program for the local communities distressed the people to shift from DMI and join other Micro Finance Institutions (MFIs).
- Lack of infrastructure for skill training and social developmental activities restraints community mobilization.
- Lack of monitoring and regular discussion with the people by Banks on repayment of credits paved a way for increased over dues.
- Marketing is a significant area of operation of the SHGs. However they face different problems in the marketing of products produced by them. Lack of sufficient orders, Lack of linkage with the marketing agencies and Lack of permanent market for the products of SHGs are key problems related to marketing.

20. Results

- Promoted **241** new SHGs and rejuvenated **3,985** old SHGs during 2019. DMI helped SHG women become financially self-reliant, the regular meetings of the group provide a platform to discuss and act on a variety of social issues such as health, nutrition, rights, etc.
- Registered individual membership data base for more than 56,395 members from 4,226 SHGs.
- Sensitized more than 11,052 rural women covering 10 districts through various awareness seminars and trainings to retain their rights and lead a dignified life with a sense of social responsibility.
- 728 rural women and young girls were trained on 12 trades to earn decent income from their sustainable livelihood. The standards of living of their families improved due to livelihood program, employability skills and employment.

- **400** women entrepreneurs enhanced their entrepreneurial skills through entrepreneur's development program. DMI helps women become economically self-sufficient through training, employment and entrepreneurial skill development.
- Food security and food sovereignty training program prepared 1014 SHG members to cultivate the habit of traditional food consumption and cultivating organic food crops.
- **22** women beneficiaries from Nagapattinam and Tiruvallur Districts received loan assistance from DMI Microcredit scheme worth to a total amount of **Rs. 7, 40,000** to improve their existing economic activities.
- Total savings: Rs. 9,04,05,553 (from 10 districts); total amount of internal Lending distributed: Rs. Rs.8,33,32,753; and total amount of external loan disbursed: Rs. 21,63,58,285. DMI focuses on economic empowerment by providing capital and other financial services to SHG women.
- DMI facilitated 1546 beneficiaries and helped them to avail 38 different schemes of the state & central Governments worth Rs. 51, **73,400**.
- DMI facilitated **592** beneficiaries to receive 5694 livestocks (chicks, goats & cows) worth **Rs. 5, 97,800** through Government schemes. DMI facilitates linkages for marginalized women to receive government schemes that they are entitled to. These public welfare schemes support the holistic development of families and the promotion of livelihood opportunities.
- DMI served 4468 community members through 25 health camps, health education program and health awareness programs to improve and protect the health and well-being of marginalized families.
- Nearly 500 women leaders were trained and prepared to participate in the elections to fulfill their democratic right to participate in the electoral process.
- During the year, 2248 have enrolled under DMI membership and the total number of renewals is 9588 women members.
- DMI team reached out to 844 PWDs and facilitated 553 PWDs to avail government schemes under community based rehabilitation program.
- 120 children parliaments were formed with 2080 children during 2019. Parents and children sensitized about the child rights and safety.
- Childline Program' protected the rights of 2050 children under various activities in Nagapattinam.

- The evening tuition center served 67 children and enhanced academic performance. School drop-outs reduced considerably due to evening school and children parliament programs.
- Twelve Student trainees from various reputed social work institutions have enriched their knowledge and skills under concurrent fieldwork in DMI.
- During this year, 390 women have taken up self-employment and involved in Catering, Small hotel, Petty shop, Fancy Shop, Xerox shop, Chapatti making, Tailoring, Vegetable selling, Bangles making, Basket making, Fish selling, and Mushroom cultivation.

Rally on prevention of Plastic pollution

Awareness Rally on plastic pollution was organised by DMI children's parliaments along with Lions Club, to make the people to rethink the current management of the production and disposal of plastics and to move towards a model that considers the entire life-cycle of these materials. **548 school children and our parliament children** participated and became aware of not to use plastic in their day to day life. And through this awareness, **using plastic is reduced** in Tumsar Block which is announced by the SDO.





Swatch Bharath-Programme

"Clean India and good health" the Theme of the rally organised in Bihar at Danapur Block. Where still people are not maintaining cleanness. 416 Children parliament children and school children were sensitized and they are making their village people to become aware of this issue.





Financial Literacy camp

Financial Literacy camp was conducted in Danapur where 150 women participated and learnt to manage their finance and develop their economic situation also works to generate employment opportunities for the underprivileged ladies of Dnapur. The team designed cloth bags made from excess fabric during the session to show the ladies about how they can make money by utilizing their stitching skills. About 150 ladies of the community, villagers and students participated in the workshop and were told about the idea of making unique and catchy bags and save money.





Sapling Plantation

Awareness program on Tree Plantation was given to our women and Members of children's parliaments. Almost 232 women and 55 children participated and benefited. Also 100 sapling were planted in Tumsar Block.







Flood relief program

DMI have organized Flood relief program during flood in Jaynager and have provided provisions to 255 affected families.





Government Schemes

DMI had organized training on availability of Government Schemes for all SHG women which helped the poor pregnant mothers, widows, and low-income families to gain access to Government Scheme.

Total beneficiaries are 325 women and youths.

DMI Developmental Approaches

- 1. Recovering, Rehabilitation, reunification and mainstreaming of vulnerable children, young girls from trafficked, child labours and enable to have a dignified life.
- 2. Promoting community teachers through intensive residential teacher's training and appoint them as professional teachers to improve the quality of education
- 3. Introducing community School to mainstream schooling by reducing school drop outs.
- 4. Facilitating African marginalized farming communities to feed themselves and promoting sustainable farming methods.
- 5. Reducing household poverty by promoting Self Help Groups, entrepreneurship and enable the target community to live a meaningful life.

- 6. Sensitizing community through community health outreach program and promoting preventive and curative health measures.
- 7. Launching a war foot relief and rehabilitation program and promote peace and reconciliation (PRC peace and reconciliation committee) and foster community reintegration.
- 8. Touching the lives of HIV/AIDS by providing nutritious food and counselling services through social care program.
- 9. Working with GBV (Gender-based Violence) and sensitizing the communities through community meetings, awareness campaigns and cultural program to bring attitudinal changes and evolve community protection mechanism.
- 10. Enabling youth to bring out their potential through vocational trainings thereby make them to be vibrant in the socio-economical strata.

1. Tanzania

"DMI's a unique approach for more than a decade to address the people's plight and bring out change among the poor people in Tanzania is an ongoing process and their venture paying a dividend now"

1.1. Wings Mobile School







The year 2019 gave a chance to 115 underprivileged youth to acquire a vocational skill through Wings Mobile School on beautician and computer. The short term course such as beautician (58) computer (57) course which enabled them to acquire vocational skill as well as the increased the Confidence level as the employability. The approach of reaching out to the target group at their doorstop is new and unique to the community. It gained a lot of appreciation from the communities and participants as the training made the youth more assertive and employable fetching income and dignified life.

1.2. Social Care program for people living with the HIV/AIDS

In 2019, 75 mother and children to socio-economically belong backwards nourished with monthly nutrition. The programme helped the mother and child to have normal growth and healthy life. We gave them health awareness and training and support to live a decent life in the community. As you are aware that the **DMI** people supports living



HIV/AIDS by providing counselling, health tips and nutritious food. Our intervention helped 75 target people including children. We organized health seminars, recreational activities to engage them actively and also enhance their confidence.

1.3. Women empowerment





Our main focus was indeed on Women to realize their potential to make use of productive purpose. We have organized the marginalized women and introduced the SHGs approach. Trained 1471 members from 71 SHGs and promoted them to federation level and also strengthen the DMI's Women World. We felt that the multifaceted approach of DMI facilitated the women to address household poverty through a collective process; we helped them to accomplish socio-economic empowerment. The members of the groups have undergone various training to lead a useful life to the family and community. Twenty (20) women among the group members attended the training on entrepreneurship.

Forty six people engaged in Batik printing, making a candle, soap, soap powder and poultry gave a sizable income from the ventures. The members of the SHGs have given training on Health matters, Human Rights, Human trafficking, leadership training, and child protection which enhanced the level of understanding the issues existing in the communities.

1.4. Educational support for children

We realized that the Education to Children of the is one prime mechanisms to drive the country into the path of peace and development. Therefore, we encourage the poor children to continue schooling and prevent dropouts; we provide them with educational materials such as uniform, notebooks, pen, pencil and school bag. Through our Special Educational Support Program, we



reached out to five hundred (500) poor students from 10 schools received educational supports such as school stationery and other educational materials to continue their studies. The mission in education make the children regularly attend the school and reduce the school dropout

1.5. The rehabilitation of victims of trafficking



More than a decade of work experience in Human Trafficking gave extra motivation to rehabilitate more victims of trafficking. We work with different stakeholders – village leaders, teachers, police, media, key government departments, like-minded NGOs and local communities in sensitizing and addressing trafficking issue.

1.5. a. Drop-in centre to screen the neediest

Our intervention towards the rehabilitation of the victim of human trafficking brought a positive transformation in their life of 84 girls. They were the victims of human trafficking, 62 among them In the drop-in centre given routine medical check-ups.

All the inmates in the drop-in centre given the life-oriented skill training comprise of self-awareness, self-confidence, leadership, assertiveness, stress management, human right etc. Our approach enabled the victims to witness the **r**esilience in dealing with difficult conditions. Remarkably, 21 victims from the drop-in centre reunified with their family in the year 2019.

1.5.b Long-term Rehabilitation

The neediest 63 beneficiaries have been undergoing nine months comprehensive rehabilitation program. During their stay, they learn a vocational skill, life skill, and attend regular counselling services. With the help of the project team, we establish contacts with their family and after necessary preparation, they would be reunified with their family and relatives.





1.5. c. Community Sensitization and Lobbying

We arranged many outreach activities well as public as awareness programs on the issue of human trafficking and child labour. Through our outreach, we reached out directly to 2733 and indirectly 8209 community members, leaders. They got sensitized on the trafficking issue and pressurized them address the issue in their locality.



We also created a good rapport with like-minded NGOs, police department, lawyers and social welfare department to address the issue. Through our informal network, we influenced the state to bring effective policy-level changes in addressing the issue.

DMI's women groups contributed cash and kind to the fellow citizen to meet their emergency need. The cluster federation contributed 1500 nos bricks for constructing school laboratory. And also donating weighing scale, cash to Government Clinic and cancer hospital proved the women's social responsibility in attending people in need.









1.6. Children parliaments

Thirty (30) students in 10 schools participated in the Children parliament aiming to promote the leadership attitude, awareness on civic maters. This sort of training to the young ones bring out the social responsibility among the young men and women in the future.



1.7. Special events

• On 9th March 19, we commemorated International Women's Day, to mark the occasion, conducted two seminars on Cancer and Women Rights. There were 504 women participated





• On 15th June 2019, commemorated Children Day where 704 children participated, the honour of the guest was Ubungo municipal Director Mama Beatrice Kwai.



On August 19, the Sports Day five schools from conducted. various places participated. The sports events such as football, netball, race etc conducted aiming to build a sportive spirit among the children and creating good relationship with the school.



• On October, Caritas Germany Miss Irene and Mr.Ivo visited Tanzania to review the program and they visited the two centres (Drop-in centre and Rehabilitation centre), Child watch cell committee, Spring of hope Alumni and women groups.





• On 15th October 2019, the networking meeting of different organization and government department to share their activities in the communities and the way to strengthen our approach to control Human trafficking.





2. South Sudan

South Sudan is one of the fragile regions in the World Map due to the continuous violence and ethnic classes. The mission of DMI sisters for the last 6 years made remarkable changes among the lives of the target population in the State of Gogriel, Juba and Yirol

2.1. Relief, rehabilitation and reintegration program





Juba, Under Peace Relief Rehabilitation and Reintegration (PRRR), peace clubs in 10 School were formed. The peace club comprising 125 boys and 125 girls given training on peace-building mechanisms and to mediate minor pupil-to-pupil disputes through peaceful means. Further, 56 Peace and Reconciliation Committees comprising of 919 female. Among them, 24 male trained on peace and conflict resolution and leadership.

Alek and Ajoko communities in Gogriel state 1,000 primary school children aged 7 to 14years in 7 schools' peace clubs engaged with different peace-building initiatives in their communities. The intervention of SDMIC in peace committees, the long-standing dispute between Alek and Ajoko communities amicably settled by fencing in between and accept live along with them in peace.

2.1.a. Education in Emergency

In the year 2019, six learning centres created under the mission in education and having classes up to 4 which made access to education over 6,000 boys and girls in the Internally Displaced Persons Camps (IDPs) and it helped host communities too. Besides, to meet the need of children, the SDMIC constructed 5 Temporary Learning Structures (TLSs) in 3 community schools, a school hand-washing facilities and furniture in the PoC. Through parents meetings, the consequence of the harmful traditional practices, not sending girl child to school and yearly marriage addressed.

- With the partnership of UNICEF and the Ministry of General Education, SDMIC provided training to 270 teachers from 15 community nursery and primary schools. The topic covered in the curriculum is Early Childhood Development, Psychosocial Support, Core subjects contents and Teaching Methodologies which helped the participants to strengthen the teaching skill.
- Teaching and learning materials were distributed to 5,600 pupils and teachers of the 15 community schools in Juba.
- Under SDMIC's Child Sponsorship Programme, 135 Children benefited (children who lost their parents (single or both) in the war) from 16 villages in Jubek State.
- Parents Teachers Associations (PTA) were formed in each of the fifteen community schools and provided them with training on their roles and responsibilities in strengthening the community schools





2.1.b.Medical support and promotion of Health care promoters

In 2019, SDMIC provided emergency relief support to IDPs living in the camps and those living with their relatives in the host communities. There were 6,000 people assisted with medical treatment and consultation under the programme of Peace, Relief, Rehabilitation and Reintegration (PRRR).

With the help of a medical doctor, SDMIC sister facilitated the weekly medical camp



supported by the team comprises of 12 barefoot doctors who provide preventive health care services to the communities.

2.2. Prevention of Gender-Based Violence

SDMIC addressed the issue of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) concentrating 10 villages by organising GBV campaigns by adopting the method of advocacy, lobby, training, trauma healing and counseling, casework, group work and assistance in kind etc. In 2019, there were 40 victims rescued from GBV and enabled them to lead a dignified life.

2.3. Food security program

SDMIC understands the need for relief food aid at critical times, however, it may be development-oriented for the farmers to be able to increase their food production and build resilience. Our Food Security and Livelihood program supported 2,758 farmers (1,791)



male, 967 female) in 20 villages. They formed 89 Farmer's Association added about 3000 acres of land for cultivation in 2019.

Besides, 2548 farmers (921 male and 1516 female) benefited through food security programme by collecting Groundnut, Sorghum and Cowpeas Collard, Onions, Eggplant, Okra, Tomato and watermelon, Fruit trees (Guava 650, Papaya 964, Banana 180

2.4. a.Diploma in Agriculture

In 2019, our ongoing diploma in Agriculture Extension Workers necessary agricultural providing and inputs enhanced 26 skills youths including two women to become as an Agriculture Extension Workers. They could able to lead the local farmers through basic improved farming practices like crop spacing,



weeding, and organic manure preparation aiming to improve the agriculture production.

2.4.b.Distribution of goats

In 2019, as part of the food security and income generation program, the SDMIC distributed chicken and goats to 198 families which were headed by vulnerable women, widow and landless farmers to increase their household income.



2.5. Vocational skill training for youths

The SDMIC embarked on various vocational skills training for young women and men. Forty (40) young women between the ages of 18 to 35 years participated in the three months of beauty arts training in 2019. This would help them to set up their micro-enterprise in their local communities to generate income to support their families.



2.6. Community schooling

The Five community Schools catered the educational need of 2080 boys and girls in the area. Besides imparting education, the school served with the nutritious mid-day meals to the children in the school. Quoted that the "community school approach not only addressed



the educational needs of the children but also the issue of malnourishment which hinders the physical growth of the children". The outcome of our educational approach impacted in reducing dropouts drastically and brought down the malnourishment considerably among children.

2.7. Self Help Group promotion



Empowering women through Shelf Help Groups is one of the approaches adopted by SDMIC to liberate women from socio-economic bondage. In 2019, 240 Women Self Help Groups upgraded and engaged them in Savings and Loan Schemes to increase additional income in the location of Gogriel, Yirol, and Juba.

2.8. Microcredit program



The women who supported with vocational skill training and agricultural inputs brought together in organising them into Self Help Groups and orienting on the savings and loans scheme

The total amount of SSP 8,454,663 (\$52,841) transacted as refundable loan among the target population of 4,943 members from 240 SHGs.

2.9. Special Events

• With the support of mission partners, SDMIC organized an annual event on Back to Learning Campaign (BTL) with the theme of **"Education is your right, It is time to exercise it".** There were about 1000 students and 140 teachers from 65 schools participated and the Hon. DrWaniSule the Minister of Education, South Sudan was the guest of the honour on 10th of May 2019.





• SDMIC hosted the National Girls Education Day 2019 at SDMIC Campus, Gurei and the Minister of Education Jubek state participated and delivered the keynote address on 26th of July 2019. There were about 1085 students attended and the Gifts given to the toppers (girls) of P8 examination.





- SDMIC commemorated the International women's Day 2019 by creating awareness on Women's Right and there were 1800 women participated one-kilometer walk to mark the day on 20th March 2019.
- They also commemorated the following days to bring awareness among the community people at large. They are namely, World peace day, International women's day, Africa Child day, World food day and Hand washing campaign.

3. MALAWI

In Malawi, particularly in the Lilongwe and Dowa regions, we focused on the marginalized, downtrodden and oppressed women and children. We empowered them with our socio, economic and political development activities. The activities mainly on the group meeting, group formation, visiting children, literacy, games, education campaign, and tuition class and children parliament.

3.1.Adult literacy program

SDMIC gives values "women literacy and empowerment" through the adult literacy. There are about 150 women from three areas benefited from our intervention. Some of them keen in regularly attending the class and the remaining attending class alternative days. The literacy program enabled them to enhance their self-confidence,



day-to-day activities in the community and expanded their space to understand the world.

3.2 Educational programme for children

At Dowa district, Special classes arranged for the school dropout children and highly motivated the parents of the children. The feasible environment for learning encouraged the children to attend classes. There were more than 500 children attended the classes.

Two hundred and fifty dropout children helped in 2019. An intensive education given to 50 children for 6 months to bridge them to main stream schooling.





3.3.Children parliament

With the concept of the children parliament, SDMIC nurtured the civic awareness and individual responsibilities among 25 children in our working areas. The approach of working with the children strengthened the leadership attitude and increase the confidence level of the children. doubt, our effort in nurturing children never goes to vain but deliver fruits in future.

3.4.Self Help Group promotion

In 2019, 40 new groups formed from 600 members. Seventy five (75) SHGs in various villages got motivation about the SHGs and record writings etc..Through the SHGs trainings, the members got to know about the basic knowledge in handling group activities and to understand the norms of the group.



3.5.Livelihood promotion for women

In 2019, there were 2010 members from 192 SHG groups participated in skill training organised by the SDMIC. They learnt the skill of producing soap, washing powder, vim, candle cushion slipper making etc which making, eventually going to increase the



household income. Hope is that the "increased income would enhance the quality of life of the women groups".

3.6. HAIR SALON AND TAILORING TRAINING:

2019, DMIIn August conducted training on tailoring course (27 women) and Saloon (Hair plating) (25 women). Totally, fifty two (52) young women completed the training and started to make use of their learnt skill. No doubt, this would increase the employability and created an opportunity to start their own.



3.7. Community Health and Hygiene:

In 2019, we gave orientation to 250 women on Health awareness particularly the common diseases like Malaria, TB, Cancer HIV/AIDS which are prevalent among the communities. This made them to understand the



health issues and adopt basic preventive as well as curative measures.

Agriculture promotion:

In 2019, 100 women members from shelf help groups given special training on sustainable agriculture practices. They also received tools and quality seeds to increase the agriculture production as wells as to reduce the household poverty.



3.8. Group Business through Micro Credit

DMI enabled the members of the self-help group member (108) with the microcredit to do different activities based on their acquired skills. The activities like selling the soap, surf, vessels, Cetinje, tomato and vegetable. They invested MWK 136,500 money and gained the cross profit of MWK 146,000.



3.9 Human Rights for leaders

DMI organised a workshop on Human rights. Seventy-five (75) women participated in the workshop. Important topics like Torts and consumer protection Act, breach of contracts, liability to the aggrieved/affected, etc, discussed. The 75 women got an opportunity to understand their right.



3.10. Special events

- On 25th March 19 village people commemorated the International Women's Day where the local chiefs of the village and 100 women participated. Awareness talk and distribution of nutrition to the needy were the important feature of the Day. Rev. Sr. Rita, the Mother Superior General of DMI was the guest of honour.
- DMI commemorated the Children's Day. There were 250 children participated in the programme. The member of Parliament for Women Development was the guest of the honour to mark the occasion.

4. ZAMBIA

In 2019, DMI further strengthened its development work in two locations namely Chipata and Lusaka. The brief note on the implementation of the core program are given as below.

Formation of SHG



The DMI's intervention in women's development by keeping faith on the slogan, "It is said that when you empower a woman, you empower the entire nation" and marching towards forming Self Help Groups and promoting them into productive purposes and life change activities.

During the year 2019, we formed 52 new groups comprising 678 members. The members given opportunity to know about savings, life skills, economic activities etc which created a tremendous changes within themselves and with their families

4.1. Sustainable agriculture program



DMI arranged training on "Climate Smart Agriculture" to various villages and training extended to 14 days to cover the farmers in need. Mr. Sivamlandu was a resource person and he covered the topics on Organic forming and method of vegetables cultivation. They visited the field and the farmers explained through demonstration. It. helped women

farmers (2145) to upgrade their knowledge on unsustainable farming and to increase agriculture productivity

4.2. Agriculture and allied activities:



The women farmers (956) from 10 villages participated the training in animal husbandry and majority of them shown interest in engaging in the piggery. Distributed piglets to Members of 39 groups to increase their household income through the scheme.

Twenty one (21) from the five federation started the bee keeping after getting a 3 day intensive training and with the support of field demonstration. We also assisted with bee heifers to 5 location. In general, the beneficiaries were comfortable in making an additional income through our income oriented activities.

Drip Irrigation:

DMI initiated drip irrigation at three locations namely Vubwi, Vizenge and simony.

Made over 450 community people involved in the drip irrigation by the way of preparation of land, pipe installation and seedling which improved agriculture production and increased income. The drip irrigation method addressed the household food requirement.





Training on Food Basket:

DMI organized two days training in October 17-18thtraining on Dry Food basket making. There were 18 men and women participated and learnt the skill of preserving fruits and veritable. The training helped them to save the fruits and vegetables from decaying.





4.3. Microcredit assistance

With the credit support of DMI, more than 3500 entered into various economic activities such as gardening, Mushroom cultivation, Hammer mill, Bee Keeping, saloon, petty shop, fruit selling, Catering, Bricks making, pots making, Handy craft, Piggery, poultry, Goat rearing, photo copy shop, Butchery shop, sausage making, Grocery and Bakery etc to increase their household income and reduced the household poverty.

4.4. The Self Help Groups and the Outcome:

The year 2019, the DMI's approach influenced more than 3000 women farmers of SHGs directly and other farmers in the communities indirectly created a visible outcome. They are as follows

- Sixty per cent of the (60%) of women members in SHGs have regular saving
- 57% of target women participated in income generation activities and thereby their income increased to 5% more than earlier
- 3400 women participated and strengthened their capacity through various training programs
- 43% of target farmers have learnt to cultivate different crop adopting varieties of farming methods and using quality seeds
- The activities of the DMI farmers created an impact directly or indirectly among the other farmers in the community.

4.5. Gender Based Violence:

DMI organized Trainers of Trainee (ToT) on Gender Based Violence. There were 48 women participated and received certificates from His Grace Rt.Rev. George Lungu Bishop of Chipata. The trainer conducted training on Gender Based Violence in their communities. There were 1867 members participated and got sensitized on the area of Gender Based Violence.





4.6. Community schools

DMI got two tuition centers in Lusaka and Chipata which helped 300 dropout children pursue their mainstream schooling.



Children Parliament:

DMI conducted 39 children parliament programme where 550 children benefited and conducted different capacity building training to equip and enhance them in their rights and duties. The topic covered such as leadership, child rights, Gender Based Violence, Human Trafficking, value education and health and hygiene.



VOCATIONAL SKILLS TRAINING CENTER

In 2019, 47 students of 8th batch of DMI's vocational training programme successfully completed the vocational training on Tailoring, computer, cosmetology and catering. The course enabled them to get employed in various sectors of different companies. The 47 beneficiaries of the training commented that they felt happy as they are employable and skill oriented.



4.7. Community health awareness program

Ill-health and lack of health awareness among the community particularly the women folk seen common among the target population. To overcome the issues, DMI created an hour health programme on "Health Awareness" comprises of talk, demonstration, group discussion, questions



and answers and like 19 such activities introduced in the target community in the year 2019.

4.8. Special events

• DMI commemorated International Women's Day under the them on Think Equal, Build smart, Innovate for Change". Over 2100 women from different area attended the day events. According to the participants. "It brought them new energy and able to negotiate with government to provide micro credit loan".



 DMI marked the occasion of International Children's Day under the them on "Humanitarian Action in Africa Children's Rights first" There were about 600 children participated, many of them collected prizes for their achievement in sports and academic activities. And the programme made the day more colorful than any other days.



- DMI women's world and farmers meet organized to strengthen their unity and establish the network of the farmers in agriculture development.
- Ogansied Agriculture Expo 2019 to showcase the farmers talents through their agriculture produce.



5. CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC



DMI's intervention indeed a kind of solace to the socio-eco- psychologically scattered people of the war affected country, CAR. The last three years of working with them, the efforts which we deployed through our implementation strategy and the untiring effort of the staff marched towards in changing the lives of 4,700 (35,906 indirect) people from 44 villages in four states of CAR.

5.1. Promoting women entrepreneurs

This year DMI gave intensive training on flower and decoration training Soap and liquid soap making, Herbal medicine to Strengthen the women entrepreneurship through the entrepreneur activities 875 beneficiaries enhanced their knowledge and acquired skill.

5.2. Agriculture program



Agriculture plays a vital role in alleviating household poverty among the lives of women in CAR. The training on sustainable agriculture for the self help groups enabled 230 women acquired skill on agriculture practice. And also 800 farmers received agriculture tools and seeds to improve their agriculture produce the FAO's security programme. To face the economic challenge,

the 110 women of SHGs engaged in poultry to earn additional income to meet the household need.

5.3. Skill training for women



There were 356 young women participated and acquired the skill on Paper Chain, making Slipper, Catering and Tailoring. The skill training not only acquired skills but also developed confidence among themselves.

5.4. Visiting war-affected areas

DMI's regular visit to the war affected communities helped to restore their confidence and self esteem. And also enabled them to identify the problems and how to face the to live peacefully in their communities.







5.5. Community school program

Community school approach was one of the vital programmes for the children to pursue education. Due to the poor economic condition many children were off the school (dropouts) and their leaning discontinued. To address the menace, DMI put a lot of effort in running 3 community schools in which 375 school dropouts, orphan and other economically weaker children enrolled. We gave them educational materials, quality education and midday meal. This helped to avoid absenteeism among the children for schooling and received good response from the community.



5.6. Relief work for IDPs

The October 2019 flood in Bangui CAR made people life miserable and many of them lost their livelihood, place to stay, pet as well s domestic animals and the small property they had. About 6000 people forced to move to the secured place to encounter the natural calamity. To bring peace and normalcy among the displaced people, DMI made a catalyst role in enabling them with counseling, providing medical supply and distribution of food. In some of the area where boats were used to rescue the people in emergency and the DMI sisterthe staff venture their lives to save the people in emergency.





5.7. Special events:

1. DMI CAR organized International Women Dayby gathering and 2300 women. It was an eye opener for the women to know their civic rights and informative information.







2. Mothers day was commemorated, there were 120 mother participated to know the importance of parenting and pre and post natal care.



3. World Peace day commemorated, 450 people attended and peaceful staying with the community discussed.





4. Five twenty people attended the World Food Day commemorated by DMI,CAR. Important of food stuff and the role of women and the small farmers in increasing food stuff.





6. Papua New Guinea (PNG)

DMI mission in PNG with very many challenges started the work inDecember 2018. The activities launched in and around by creating effective Moresby rapport with the communities. The yearlong activities of forming groups, creating awareness Health Hygiene, Leadership Training, Catering and community welfare activities brought out



positive changes among the target people.

6.1. Self Help Groups,

In 2019, we formed total 52 women groups inclusive of 1014 women. Training on social awareness, leadership, preparing nutritional meals for the childrenand health awareness given to promote quality of life of the target population. The Self Help Groups (SHGs) motive to do social service like cleaning the blocked drainage & street, cleaning of Police station, and visited Government hospital and the sick. This kind of social service activities of the women group created an awareness among the general public to help humanity in need and attend the social responsibility.

6.2 Trainings to Women in SHGs

There were 1672 women members trained in health and hygiene, leadership, Shelf Help Group fornation, Records maintenance and cooking.



6.3. Children Parliament

In 2019, Twelve (12) children parliament group formed from 342 children aiming to promote the leadership attitude, awareness on civic matters. This sort of the children parliament to the young ones gives an opportunity to do something useful towards society's betterment.



Special Activities:

- Commemorated the International Children's day where 840 Children participated highlighted the importance of education and sport and health.
- International Women Day observed, more than 1299 women participated and the role of women shaping the family and community discussed and culture events made the day more colorful.
- Made a visit to Indian High Commission, PNG and met the Indian Ambassador to PNG and present him the DMI activities at PNG

• Made a visit to different NGOs (NCD) National Capital District) We Care Foundation, Big Rooster, PSI (Population Services International) Tailoring Unit and other Organization to get to know them finding the possibility of working together for community development.

Concluding Remark

As far as I am concerned about the DMI's development Mission in partners countries which I put it, "seen more the need but less resource – human and materials". And I am humbly seeking His blessing to expand DMI mission to serve the needy. Once again, I take this opportunity to thank one and all for carrying along to serve God and humanity.

All the students who have appeared in the public examinations have passed and some have excelled in their studies.



ACCREDITATION OF PROGRAMMES

In Tanzania, Tanzania Commission for University (TCU) and a team of members from NACTE and the Tanzania Nursing and Midwifery Council (TNMC) visited the respective colleges for inspection and accreditation of programs and issued certificates of accreditation to the University. Zambia also underwent a rigorous accreditation process by the Higher education authority, ACCA and HPCZ and all the programmes offered are fully accredited. HEA institutional audit was successfully conducted with a score of 93%.
